



## University of Toronto, Faculty of Applied Science & Engineering First Year Program Job Posting for Undergraduate Teaching Assistants, CUPE 1 Fall Term 2025 (September - December)

The First Year Program in the Faculty of Applied Science & Engineering will be hiring a team of **undergraduate** (3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> year) Teaching Assistants to support APS100: Orientation to Engineering.

Up to **34** positions available.

APS100H1F — Orientation to Engineering: This course is designed to help students transition into first-year engineering studies, and to develop and apply a greater understanding of the post-secondary academic learning environment, the field of engineering, application of mathematics and sciences in an engineering context, and properly frame engineering (education) as a socio-technical, people-centred endeavor. Topics include techniques for effective learning, time management, problem solving, successful teamwork, effective communications, test and exam preparation, stress management and wellness, engineering ethics and professionalism, academic integrity and the Student Code of Conduct, applications of math and science in engineering undergraduate research, extra- and co-curricular involvement, and engineering disciplines and career opportunities. Estimated Enrollment: 1125.

The contracts will be for at least **36 hours**, at the rate of **\$52.97** per hour, plus 4% vacation pay.

**Duties:** APS100 - Orientation to Engineering Undergraduate TAs (UG TAs) will deliver weekly tutorials using a common course tutorial outline. UG TAs will attend a weekly course meeting to develop their tutorial materials and learn ways to create positive learning communities within the first year Core 8 program.

## **Qualifications:**

- Must be enrolled as an undergraduate student in their 3rd or 4th year of a Core 8 program and must have completed first year in a Core 8 or TrackOne program.
- Must have a strong academic record or have demonstrated significant academic improvement throughout their undergraduate degree.
- Must be available for training in late August/early September.

Students on PEY Co-op during the 2025 Fall term or students who completed first year in the Engineering Science program are **not eligible**.

**Important Skills:** Demonstrated ability to manage academic requirements and extra-curricular involvement. Experience with facilitation or leading activities in a learning environment or camp is a strong asset. Ability to make connections, encourage and motivate others, and model appropriate & professional behaviour. Prior experience being a mentor or teacher will be considered an asset. Completion of the U of T Tutor Training Program (UT3) is an asset.

**Schedule:** Tutorial schedule will be available on <u>Timetable Builder</u> in June, and section assignments will be determined prior to hiring.
