

**Emergency Job Posting – CUPE 3902 Unit 1
Teaching Assistant
APS112T-Summer 2025**

Course Description: This course introduces and provides a framework for the design process, problem solving and project management. Students are introduced to communication as an integral component of engineering practice. The course is a vehicle for practicing team skills and developing communications skills. Building on the first course, this second course in the two Engineering Strategies and Practice course sequence introduces students to project management and to the design process in greater depth. Students work in teams on a term length design project. Students will write a series of technical reports and give a team based design project presentation.

At least one (1) Teaching Assistant position is available for **APS112H1 F, from May 01-June 30, 2025** The contract will be for at least **80 hours, at the rate of \$52.97 per hour, plus 4% vacation pay.**

Qualifications: Applicants must be able to demonstrate considerable depth of knowledge and experience in the subject area. All applicants must have excellent communication skills – both oral and written. The applicant must be able to present in a clear voice and explain concepts clearly. Previous experience is the more relevant criterion than the need to acquire experience in respect of this posted position.

Duties include:

- Delivering tutorials (with Instructor) throughout the Summer term May 01-June 30, 2025
- Providing scheduled office hours for students
- Marking assessments and grading final presentations
