APS112 -Engineering Strategies and Practice II

The First Year Program in the Faculty of Applied Science & Engineering will be hiring **at least eighteen (18)** Teaching Assistants to support the Engineering Strategies and Practice (ESP) first-year engineering design course, APS112H1S in the Winter 2026 term (January 5, 2026 – April 30, 2026). Each Teaching Assistant facilitates a 2-hour weekly tutorial of 32-36 students (6 teams). For more information about the course: <http://www.esp.engineering.utoronto.ca/>

APS112H1S – Engineering Strategies & Practice II: An introduction to, and implementation of, a framework for the design process, which is used to teach in context, problem solving, professional communication, and team skills. Students are introduced to design, communication and teamwork as integral and inter-related components of engineering practice. This first course in the two Engineering Strategies and Practice course sequence introduces students to the process of engineering design, including broader considerations, written professional communication, and to strategies for successful team work. Students will write a series of team and individual engineering reports. Estimated course enrolment: 1125

The contracts will be for at least **70 hours, at the rate of \$53.92 per hour, plus 4% vacation pay.**

Qualifications: Previous experience is the more relevant criterion than the need to acquire experience in respect of this posted position. Demonstrated ability in marking written assignments. Prior experience with teaching and supporting first year students is an asset. Knowledge, enthusiasm and passion for the engineering profession and understanding of the engineering design process; have good facilitation skills, and excellent communication skills. A high degree of confidence in the ability to advise on and assess writing is required. Industrial experience, particularly in technical communication, project management or a supervisory role, is an asset.

Duties: These teaching assistants will work directly with the course coordinator & instructors, and ESP Office staff and are responsible for: (a) facilitating weekly 2-hour tutorials (b) marking written assignments & midterm (c) assisting with final presentation logistics. APS112H1 TAs are also required to attend, in-person: A weekly teaching team meeting and/or marking benchmarking meetings scheduled on Mondays from 9-11 am, invigilation for 2 hour midterm date, TBD.
